Is it useful to aim for 'Bioregions' with even higher ambitions than 25% uptake? Which are differences and possible synergies between regenerative and organic farming?

This and more will be dealt with during the conference 'Added Value of the Organic Farmer, Bioregions' on 13 and 14 October at the Ecommunitypark in Oosterwolde. The programme will be in English and consists of presentations by leading speakers from the Netherlands and abroad, workshops, and farm visits.

The conference is part of a wider programme which includes October 12 (only in Dutch) on Opportunities of the Common Agricultural Policy, the Soil as Basis.
