Total Canadian Potato Storage Holdings on February 1, 2022, are 22% above the 3-yr. average and up 26% compared to February of last year. What began as a PEI issue on November 22 when the United States border was closed to their potatoes, has become a Canadian issue, backing up supply across many parts of the country. The two most western provinces of BC and Alberta are showing declines of 5% compared to their 3-yr. averages on February 1st.
